The Routt Recreation Roundtable is being convened to provide insights and recommendations on recreational issues within Routt County. The community forum will represent various user groups and agencies and work to develop a collaborative environment for discussion, deliberation and consensus-building. The Roundtable will provide advice and guidance to land and recreation managers engaged in planning processes and/or policy decisions. Please note that anyone applying for a seat on the Roundtable must agree to abide by the Charter. This includes committing to regular participation in the monthly 2-3 hour meetings to begin, followed by quarterly meetings thereafter. It also includes a willingness to be a part of a collaborative group whose aim is to build trust and understanding, and work toward consensus on a variety of recreational issues. By submitting this form, you certify that you have read and will abide by the Charter if seated on the Roundtable.

The Roundtable is being assembled by a committee comprised of the Bureau of Land Management, City of Steamboat Springs, Colorado Parks and Wildlife, Routt County, and the U.S. Forest Service. This committee will oversee the creation and seating of the Routt Recreation Roundtable as well as on-going Roundtable administration and advising.

The Roundtable will include one seat each for the 16 user groups and interests listed below, as well as five 'at-large' seats, for a total of 21 total seats to be filled. At-large seats are included, and can be applied for, to capture citizens that want to participate for their general knowledge of the community and recreational issues, but don't necessarily represent any one specific user group or interest.
