MISSION

The Energy Board's mission is to foster critical thinking on the interplay between energy, environmental, and economic policy in an off-the-record, non-attributable setting.

VALUE

When asked why they participate in the Energy Board, members consistently state three key attributes that make membership valuable:

- A unique diversity of perspectives on issues that members face daily in their own organizations.
- The opportunity to leave behind individual agendas and positioning and have unique off-the-record discussions about tough issues.
- The benefit of developing meaningful relationships with other key players in the energy arena.

STRUCTURE

The Energy Board is composed of about 50 individuals representing varied perspectives on energy and climate policy from the industry, technology, environment, consumer advocacy, and state and federal government arenas. Membership is by invitation only (*see reverse for a complete list of members*) and meetings take place three times a year.

TOPICS

Energy Board discussions reflect the interests of members. Recent topics include:

- Human, environmental, & geopolitical impacts of energy supply chains
- The relationship between American Indian tribes & energy companies
- The hope & the hype related to commitments of 100% renewable energy
